


## Searching for pictures using Flickr.com

1. Do an advanced search so that you can find only pictures that have a creative-commons copyright.

**Creative Commons License**= Allows you to copy, distribute, display, and perform another person's copyrighted work, but only if you give credit.

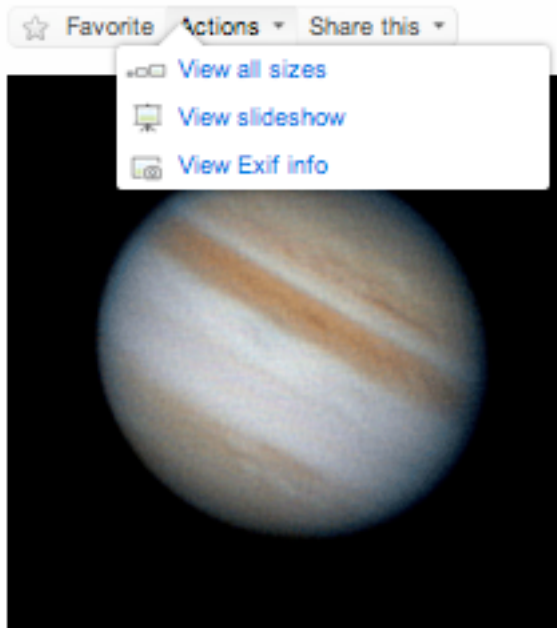

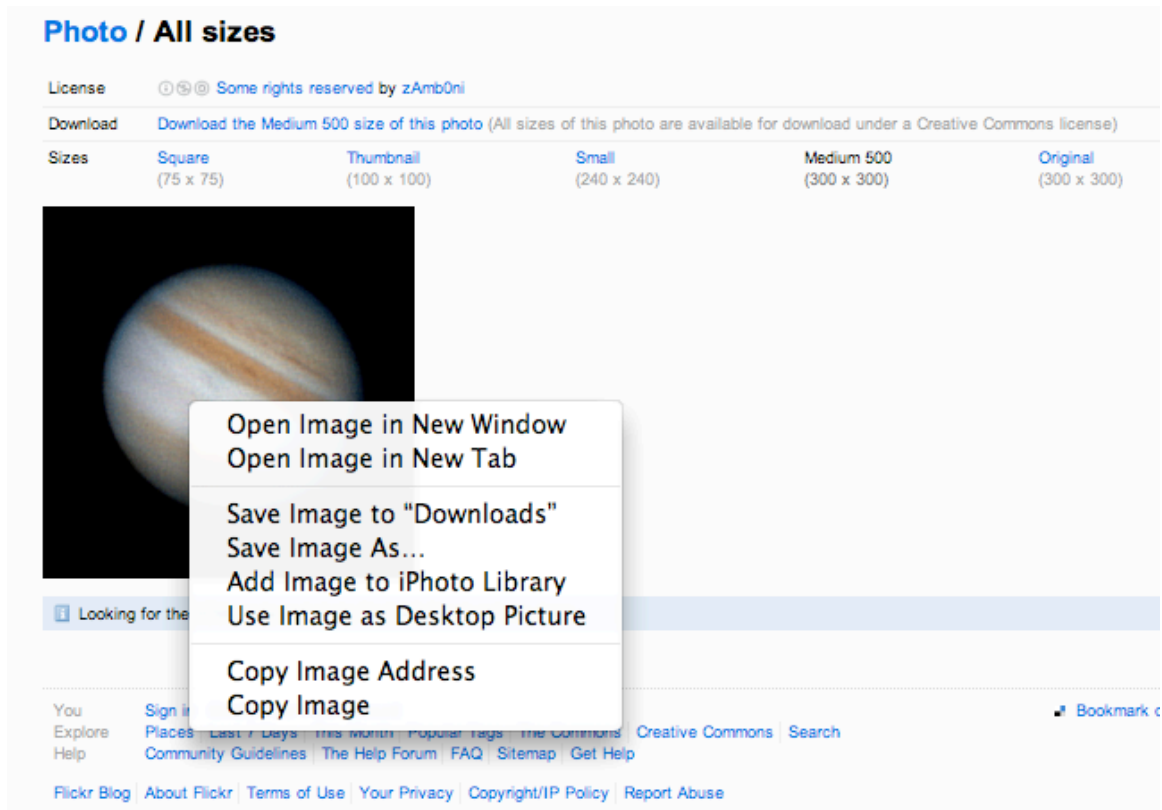

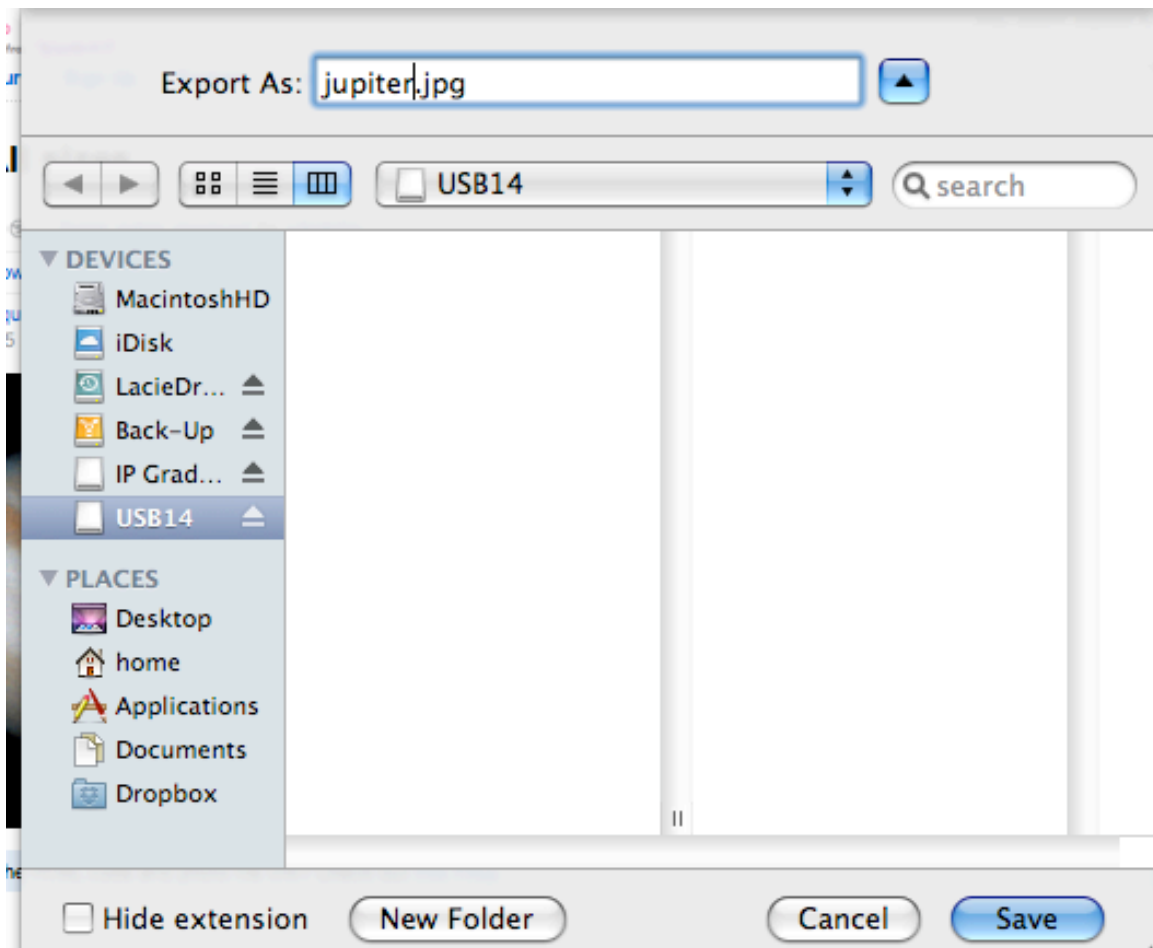
2. Click on Photo Choice
3. Click on Actions and select View All Sizes



4. Select Medium
5. Hold Control Key on Keyboard and click on image
6. Select Save Image As
